Gathering at Park Lane, London, W1K, the march will make its way to Parliament Square.

13:00 March to Parliament Square (may set off sooner)

14:15 Rally begins in Parliament Square

16:30 Rally ends.

The Restore Nature Now March is supported by a diverse group of over 300 wildlife and environment organisations (including the RSPB, The Wildlife Trusts, The Climate Coalition, WWF-UK, National Trust, WWT, Woodland Trust, Wildlife and Countryside Link, Rewilding Britain, Extinction Rebellion and Chris Packham).

Each of these organisations and many individual groups have been inviting people to register with them and sharing arrangements for joining the event.

The southbound carriage of Park Lane will be used as an assembly area for the march.

The road will be closed from 11:30. Speeches and music will begin at 12:00.

Park Lane has been divided into 4 nature themed blocks, and given letters and number references making it easy to find your group or friends!

Sign markers with reference numbers will be fixed to lamp posts on the day, & stewards will be in place to help. **WOODS** - A1 to C7; **WATER** - D8 to F17; **LAND** - G18 to J30; **AIR** - K31 to L37

Some groups will naturally align with one of the nature blocks. There's a table on this webpage showing some of the supporters and their blocks - as well as where interest or affiliation blocs like Health, Youth and Justice groups might like to meet up. It's important to remember that **nature is the overall theme**, that anyone can go in any block, and this is just a guide to help organise common interests and topics together.

The RSPB will be in the AIR block which also includes education, faith, justice, health, climate and science groups.

The natural world is in trouble and we need to take action.

This legal, peaceful, inclusive and family-friendly demonstration aims to be the biggest gathering of people for nature and climate that the UK has ever seen. It is both a celebration of British nature and a protest calling for urgent political action on the nature and climate emergencies.

We want to see UK politicians show strong domestic & global nature and climate leadership by:

- 1. Giving a pay-rise for nature
- 2. Making polluters pay
- 3. Delivering more space for nature
- 4. Putting a right to a healthy environment in law
- 5. Ensuring fair and effective climate action
